## **NCHEPM VICE CHAIR JAVIER INCLÁN FEATURED ON FEDTALK PODCAST**

WASHINGTON – The National Council of Hispanic Employment Program Managers (NCHEPM), the nation’s premiere authority on efforts to improve and accelerate Hispanic participation and representation in the Federal government, announced today the release of the FEDTalk podcast’s latest release featuring NCHEPM Vice Chair Javier Inclán.

This Hispanic Heritage Month, FEDTalk recognized efforts to increase Hispanic representation in government and government efforts to elevate Hispanic American stories to the public. The [“Celebrating Hispanic Heritage” episode](#) features Jorge Zamanillo, inaugural Director of the Museum of the American Latino, and Javier Inclán, Vice Chair of the National Council of Hispanic Employment Program Managers.

Zamanillo provides a status update on Washington D.C.’s newest museum and explains the importance of telling Hispanic American stories as an integral part of American history. He also provides listeners with a rundown of the ongoing events and galleries the museum is offering prior to its opening. Inclán discusses the value of Hispanic/Latino representation across the ranks of government, especially in leadership and how the Council works to address the recruitment and retention of Hispanics. Inclán also breaks down the Council’s theme for Hispanic Heritage Month 2022, *Unidos: Inclusivity for a Stronger Nation*.
