OCT. 11 AND 13: 2022 FALL VIRTUAL LEADERSHIP FORUM

WASHINGTON – The National Council of Hispanic Employment Program Managers (NCHEPM), the nation’s premiere authority on efforts to improve and accelerate Hispanic participation and representation in the Federal government, announced today its inaugural Fall Virtual Leadership Forum in partnership with the League of United American Citizens (LULAC) Federal Training Institute (FTI) and the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO).

This free, collaborative event is **open to all government employees** and will provide participants with leadership and professional development training focused on one or more of the five Senior Executive Service (SES) [Executive Core Qualifications](#) (ECQs). Day 1 workshop tracks also will provide Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility (DEIA) practitioners and allies with the tools and resources needed to reach diverse communities; facilitate information sharing and networking; and assist in the recruitment, retention and development of Hispanics and other underrepresented talent. Day 2 will feature several 30-minute speed mentoring sessions with senior executives from across the federal government who will share their best career and leadership insights and advice to mentees.

“This is a phenomenal opportunity to enhance skills and connect with senior leaders across government,” said Glorimar Maldonado, NCHEPM Chair. “This event is open to anyone with an interest in pursuing the next steps to advance their careers and achieve the missions of their respective organizations.”

For more than 25 years, the NCHEPM has worked to share vital information and resources to assist Hispanic Employment Program Managers and other DEIA practitioners in building coalitions and networks to enhance the recruitment, development and retention of Hispanics in the federal workforce. The NCHEPM is implementing programs and initiatives to inform the work of these practitioners and thereby improve the success and sustainability of the work they undertake.
